



## **JUDO CANADA**

### **INFORMATION ON THE 2014 ELECTIONS**

Judo Canada will be holding elections during its Annual General Meeting on June 21<sup>st</sup> 2014 in Montreal, QC. This document is an invitation to the membership to get involved in the process. For more details, please see Judo Canada's By-laws or contact the national office.

#### **Offices open for election**

- **Vice President**
  - the four (4) year term is until the 2018 AGM.
- **General Secretary**
  - the four (4) year term is until the 2018 AGM.
- **Women's Leadership Representative**
  - the four (4) year term is until the 2018 AGM.

#### **Nominations** (as outlined in Judo Canada's By-laws)

Any person seeking election as an elected officer of the Association must be a Class B Member.

- (1) Class B Membership shall be available only to any person practicing judo in a club recognized by the Provincial Association where the club is located, and upon payment of the required annual fees and upon acceptance of the application for Class B Membership by the Association on the recommendation of the Class A Member of the province or territory in which such person resides, shall become a Class B Member until he resigns or ceases to be a Class B Member in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws;
- (2) Hold a yudansha grade;
- (3) In addition, the Women's Leadership Representative must be a woman;
- (4) Any member standing for an elected position on the Board must be supported by a proposal made by one or several Class A Members representing no less than 5% of the votes, and so declare by notifying the General Secretary in writing or by email not less than forty-five (45) days in advance of the Annual General Meeting at which such election shall take place.

**Voting** (as outlined in Judo Canada's By-laws n° 17)

At the annual meeting of the members of the Association election to any office shall be declared only on receipt of a simple majority of the ballots cast. In the event that two or more nominees stand for election to any one office the election procedure shall be by way of elimination unless any candidate has received a clear majority of ballots cast. Only Voting Members can cast a vote during the elections.

Voting Members

Class A Members shall be entitled to receive notice of and to attend all meetings of the members of the Association, and shall be entitled to vote at all meetings of the members of the Association except for meetings at which only members of another class are entitled to vote separately as a class. Each Class A Member shall have one (1) vote at each such meeting for each paid-up associate Class B member of such Class A Member, provided that evidence sufficient to the directors of the number of paid-up associate Class B members of such Class A Member and payment of due and fees in accordance with paragraph 3.1.2 shall be submitted by March 31st of each year

*Voting Formula*

Class A Members shall vote through the vote-carrying representative who they have duly authorized to attend a meeting of members of the Association and vote thereat. If the Class A members selects as its vote carrying representative someone else than its President, then the Class A Member shall provide the name of that their vote-carrying that representative to the Association in writing no later than fifteen (15) days in advance of each general or special meeting of members of the Association

A simple majority means a majority of the votes cast on the resolution consisting of votes cast by not less than three Class A Members, or a plurality of all eligible Class A Members but two.

In other words, under Bylaw N° 17, there will not be adjusted votes. However, the majority must come either from 50%+1 votes carried by at least three Voting Members, or from 11 provincial-territorial associations.
